






Students Performing At or Above Grade Level Expectations LALA – Winter 2023








Students Performing At or Above Grade Level Expectations LALA – Winter 2023



Students are performing lower in Math than Reading/Language from Grades 6-10 Grades 9 and 11 have the largest percentage of students on or above grade level in subjects.


Winter 2023: Students Above 40th Percentile by Grade Level



Language Usage




Students Meeting Annual Growth Target by Student Group LALA - 2022-23
