ELPAC:

A survey will be sent out for parents to fill out. This will be a notification for parents awareness in regards to the test students will be taking remotely.

ELPAC is a 2 part test. We will begin testing this October and should be done by November.

How are students classified as EL students? When students are enrolled in school, parents answer a series of questions. If they initially answer with a language other than English, they will need to take the ELPAC test.

A parent asked a questions:

What happens if a student does not pass the test? Answer: We will talk more about it in the presentation.

Criteria for students to be reclassified:

- A. Students must score overall a 4.
- B. In addition, students need to have 1 of the following. Must meet CAASPP scores, read at 1 higher than grade level, and pass English class.

Once a student reclassifies, students will no longer need to take ELD. MS: will take UA and HS: will take an elective class.

Even when a student reclassifies, they continue to receive support.

Question asked by parent:

Is this for High School students too? Answer: Yes, this is for students K-12th.

Mrs. Felix: We would like to ask parents to support our students. It is important for them to read. This will help them during testing. A lot of the requirements are for students to put effort into it. Reading is the key.
