Ms. Ochoa presented members of the school site council with the LALPA and LALA LCAP for the 2022-2023 school year. Copies of both LCAPs were distributed to members of the council.

For both LALPA and LALA, Ms. Ochoa presented an overview of the budget and how parents, students and teachers are part of deciding how some funds will be used. Ms Ochoa also outlined the goals that were set and the outcomes that were reached over the course of the academic year. Among other items, Ms. Ochoa discussed academic achievement goals, meeting the social-emotional needs of the students, and ensuring the safety of all students and staff.

Following the presentation of of each sites LCAP, Ms. Ochoa asked members of the council for their thoughts on the strengths and needs of each site.

During the LALPA presentation, a parent suggested the social media platforms be managed better, consolidating all sites instead of having separate accounts for the Primary, Middle and high schools. A parent also had a question about the suspension process and Ms Ochoa clarified. Another parent said they would like their children to have more opportunities to leave Lincoln Heights and have outing opportunities.

Regarding the strengths of LALPA, parents commented that the suspensions were very low and the expulsions were non-existent. They also commented that student engagement was very positive. Regarding the needs of LALPA, parents commented that enrollment needed to improve and absences needed to be reduced. They also would like to see more parent engagement. One parent said they would like even more social-emotional support for parents and staff. They also emphasized the need for a security guard. They would also like to see an improvement in the appearance of the school and make it more presentable.

Regarding the strengths of LALA, parents commented that the PBIS was effective. Suspension and expulsion are also fairly low. A teacher commented that they really appreciated how the LALA farm was incorporated into the school. They commented that the sports program was a strength but they suggested a cheer team or even other after school activities.

Regarding the needs of LALA, as with the primary academy, enrollment and attendance need to improve and they would like a parent coordinator. As with the primary school, they would also like to see improvements in the visual appearance of LALA.
